Danic Technology Inc. is a privately held company founded in 1994. Canadian operations are based in Ottawa, Ontario; U.S. operations, in Cambridge, Massachusetts. The company provides software, "Danic Tools", and related implementation and support services.

The Danic Tools software package is a fully customizable, 32-bit application. This person-centered, object-relational, database management system (ORDMS) is designed to support affordable, integrated, enterprise systems for health and human service agencies. Danic's object-oriented structure is built to integrate easily with other databases and applications in order to render the most comprehensive solution for human service agencies on the market today. A windows-based, web-enabled product, Danic Tools runs on a PC network, over the internet, or through Danic's web-based, data farm service.

The hallmark of Danic Tools is the ease with which it can be configured and reconfigured to fit the particular and changing needs of virtually any agency. It has been implemented in organizations providing services in the areas of developmental disabilities, mental health, child and family services, juvenile justice, employee assistance programs (EAP), and more. It is most commonly used for client management purposes, but is increasingly being used for human resources, fund raising and other agency purposes. Thanks to Danic's elegant meta-model, database and interface configurations can be modified without changing the source code; agencies are thus able to reconfigure the system themselves without vendor help.
